Dear Parents, Children & Friends,

Welcome back to the brand-new school year and a warm welcome to all our new pupils and their families, I am sure they will settle quickly into school life and enjoy their time at St Mary's School. YEAR 6 APPLICATION TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS:

How you apply for a place at secondary school depends on where you live. The application has to be made to the Local Authority in which you live. Please see below for further details.

Oldham Residents:

If your child is due to start secondary school in September 2025, we know that this is a very exciting and important time. Please note how and when you need to apply and where to access information to guide you through this process.

You will need to complete an application using the online application system available on the Oldham Council website. www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions. It's quick and easy and ensures school offers can be made efficiently via e-mail. Applying on line is the only form of application as Oldham Council no longer provides paper application forms.

The closing date for all applications is 31 October 2024 at 5pm. Any application received after this time will be classed as late and will not be processed until all the on-time applications have been allocated a school place.













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For faith schools you will need to fill in a supplementary form or provide documentation in addition to the application. Supplementary forms are available from, and returned to, the relevant school.

To enable you to have a look at what is on offer, all Oldham secondary schools will be holding open evenings during the Autumn term.

Rochdale Residents:

Parents of children who live in Rochdale should check the 'School Places' section of the Rochdale council website for details of the application process and deadlines (www.rochdale.gov.uk). Alternatively, you can contact the Admissions Team on telephone 0300 303 0340 or email school.admissions@rochdale.gov.uk for further information.

NEW RECEPTION APPLICATION TO SCHOOL SEPTEMBER 2025

You will need to complete an application using the online application system available on the Oldham Council website www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions It's quick and easy and means you get the school offer directly via email. You can find more information, a guide, and links to school websites here too. The online system opened on 1 September 2024.

In addition, any parent wishing to apply for a Reception place at St. Mary's CE Primary School <u>MUST</u> complete a supplementary form (available from the school office or download from the school website).

If you don't have access to the internet at home, there are computers in all Oldham's libraries. You will need an email address, but these are very easy to set up and staff will be happy to help.

Deadlines for making an application: Primary 15th January 2025 at 5pm

If you have any further queries, regarding admissions, please do not hesitate to contact the school office. Mother Katy will be signing forms for Reception pupils 2025 after half term, more details to follow.

Our welcome to our new Reception pupils to St Mary's School, in a whole school worship for pupils and parents, will take place on Friday 25th October with Mother Katy.
















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HARVEST SERVICE:

We invite parents with pre-school children to come into school at the beginning of the school day (from 8:30am) if they wish to have a family portrait. In response to requests by parents, we allow children to be photographed either in school uniform or appropriate clothes of parents' choice. The majority of parents still choose to have pictures in uniform and this is NOT a non-uniform day. Children should change back into their school uniform once the photograph has been taken.
