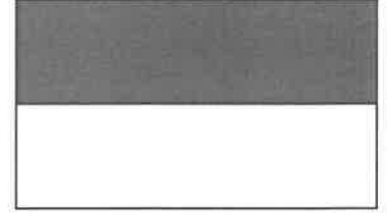


Orangutans



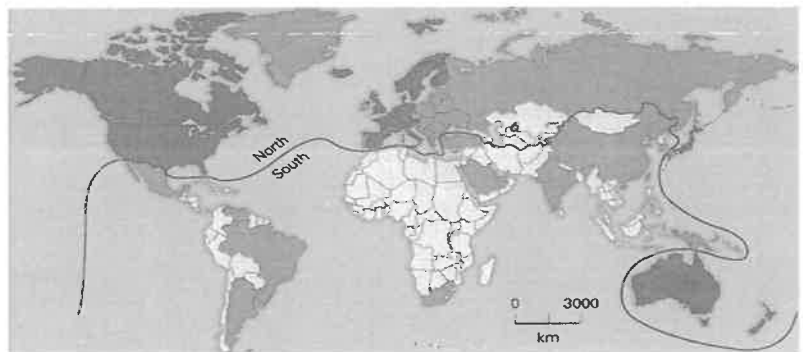
